We'd like to share them with you again.



Norma and her husband Clarence joined Pentecost first after meeting Pastor Babel at the funeral of their daughter in law's mother. Betty and husband John joined a little later, also because they liked Pastor Babel and the Hansen's were now members. Betty's comment — "the people are so nice." Norma said she has "loved it ever since (joining)." Betty also said what a wonderful pastor we now have and how lucky we are to have him.



The sisters were born and raised on the old



Piper Farm at Highway KR and Lathrop Avenue, Kenosha. There were six children in the family. Betty said it was kind of like two small families of the three older children and three younger ones.

Betty graduated from Park High School and spent a year or two in Milwaukee, then worked at Studey Dairy until her son was born. She did lots of volunteer work. She was still volunteering with the VFW Auxiliary when they did Bingo games at the Veterans' Home in Union Grove when this story was first written. Remember, she was 94 at the time! She also volunteered at the Danish American Home until it was sold. She was secretary of the board. One of the things she enjoyed doing was watching movies.



Betty's church was very important to her. She drove herself to services as long as she was able.
